From 20 to 22 June 2012, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, will host the United Nations sustainable development conference entitled RIO+20 – Making it happen. This conference will take place 20 years after the Rio Earth Summit where Agenda 21 was laid out along with agreements on deforestation, climate change, and biodiversity. While evaluating the progress made in these areas and identifying the gaps that need to be filled, the conference will focus on two issues: the green economy, within the framework of sustainable development and the eradication of poverty; and the institutional framework for sustainable development.

UIA President Albert Dubler will lead a delegation of architects from around the world to participate in this conference.


