UIA SUPPORT FOR SPAIN'S ARCHITECTS

The Superior Council of Colleges of Spanish Architects (CSCAE) alerted the UIA about a bill introduced by the Spanish Minister of the Economy and Competition which suggests **enlarging legal competency for architectural design and realisation to other professions**, in particular engineers. Professional organisations of architects as well as teachers and students of architecture in Spain were outraged at this initiative, that has been widely discussed throughout the country. UIA President **Albert Dubler** stated his support for the CSCAE position and expressed the world community of architect's concern over this proposition that threatens the foundations of our profession and contravenes Spanish laws on architecture - *Ley de ordenación de la edificación* - and the European Union directive on professional qualifications. The UIA vice-president for Western Europe, **Antonio Rivero**, also supported the UIA Spanish Section in this fight, along with the president of the Architects' Council Europe, **Selma Harrington**.

UIA BUREAU MEETING IN KHARTOUM

The UIA Bureau members held their recent meeting in Khartoum, on 30 & 31 January 2013, hosted by the **Governor of the State of Khartoum, the Minister of Human Development, Antiquities and Tourism** and the **UIA Vice-President for Africa, Hayder Ali**. Amongst the themes tabled were the translation and diffusion of the standards for sustainable construction in tropical areas RESET; the UIA strategy for responsible architecture; the organisation of the UIA congress Durban 2014.

A continuing education workshop was organised immediately following this meeting, on 2nd & 3rd February, by Hayder Ali and Fabian Llisterri. The theme: "the role of architects and engineers in the development of towns" is in line with the UN-Habitat world urban campaign. It brought together experts from the five UIA regions.

EUZEN ARCHITECTURE WINS PRIZE FOR BIOCLIMATIC SCHOOL IN CRETE

The Greek team "EuZen architecture" led by **Theodora Kyriafini** and **Fotini Lymeriadou** were awarded first prize in the international competition to design a bioclimatic school in Voutes, Crete. The jury chose their project from among the 134 submitted for consideration.

Based on a succession of patios where natural shade and ventilation assure a comfortable temperature, the concept marries traditional building techniques from the region, such as the use of rough stone, rammed earth and timber frameworks, with modern technologies to respond to today's needs.

Cheng for his contribution to creating the architectural style known as “Vancouverism.”; and Harold Kalman for his contributions to the preservation of Canada’s built heritage.

**AIA HONOURS THE MENIL COLLECTION**

The Houston art gallery ‘The Menil Collection’, designed by architect **Renzo Piano**, has been selected for the 2013 American Institute of Architects **Twenty-five Year Award**. Recognising architectural design of enduring significance, this award is conferred on a building that has stood the test of time for 25 to 35 years as an embodiment of architectural excellence. The Menil Collection was the first structure realised by Piano in the United States, and immediately propelled him to the forefront as a master in museum design.

**ADA LOUISE HUXTABLE PASSED AWAY IN NEW YORK**

Ada Louise Huxtable, **one of the groundbreaking figures in modern architectural criticism**, passed away in Manhattan, on 8 January, at 91 years of age. She was the first accredited architecture critic for the American journal **The New York Times**, and with her columns she invited the general public into the realms of urban planning, architecture and design by making them daily subjects of debate and dialogue. Ms. Huxtable was the first recipient of the **Pulitzer Prize for criticism**, and deputy curator for architecture and design at the New York Museum of Modern Art. She wrote close to a dozen books including the biography of Frank Lloyd Wright, and was a founding member of the **New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission**, showing her dedication to architectural heritage in the United States.

HERITAGE
REGION I**ENERGY PERFORMANCE IN HISTORIC EUROPEAN BUILDINGS**

Increasing energy efficiency in historic buildings is a priority theme of Research for European Cultural Heritage. The new EU directive on energy efficiency was voted last September by the EU Parliament and will be implemented in the member states beginning in 2013. The European committee on energy performance standards in historic structures (CEN/ TC 346/WG 8) contacted the UIA in its quality as an international cultural and professional organisation dedicated to conserving cultural heritage, in order to collaborate with its work programme on heritage to gain a positive contribution toward harmonising and diffusing information and working toward the goals of the directive. **Sara Van Rompaey** (member of the UIA heritage Region I work programme from Belgium) was chosen to represent architects on this committee. The committee is chaired by **Vasco Fassina**, superintendant for historical and cultural heritage in the Veneto region.

From 29 November to 1st December 2012, the faculty of architecture at **Berlin Technical University** hosted an international symposium and exhibition dedicated to new methods in architectural teaching. The event counted over 180 participants, and **more than 60 speakers from the United States, Latin America, Europe and Oceania**. They discussed **DesingBuild studios** as a hands-on, learning by doing model for teaching architecture, as an alternative that will expand the horizons of architectural research and design, and help develop socially engaged architecture projects with the cooperation of universities, architectural offices and governmental and non-governmental organisations from around the world.

Ideas, different perspectives, challenges, innovative solutions and the will and need to work together were exchanged during this three-day event that bubbled with enthusiasm. In the following months, CoCoon will work intensively to create the network platform that will make this collaboration possible. UIA Council member **Nina Nedelykov** was among the moderators at this event, representing both the **UIA** and the **BAK** (German Federal Chamber of Architects). All symposium documents will be made available on the web, while ideas and suggestions are encouraged.
